



Jubilee Journey: Pilgrims of Hope -Celebrating the Holy Year 2025 Together



Last week included with this bulletin was the decree from Bishop Persico on "plenary indulgences" for this Jubilee Year.

What is an "indulgence?"

(1471)"An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as the minister of redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury of the satisfactions of Christ and the saints." 81 From the Catechism of the Catholic Church

A plenary indulgence is a particularly powerful way to obtain remission of punishment -- on earth or in purgatory – that would have resulted from sins that were already forgiven. It covers all sins, mortal or venial, that the recipient has committed up to that time, if the person sincerely repents, detests their sins and fulfills all requirements of the indulgence. It may be applied to the living or the dead. Copies of a handy outline of what can be done to gain a plenary indulgence during this Holy Year along with the Jubilee prayer can be found in the gathering space.

cycle is to acknowledge our sins, to repent of them, and to ask God's forgiveness. Then, in the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession), grace can be restored to our souls, and we can once again resist sin.
